<i>January 13, 1946</i>	“Los Angeles gets Rams’ Pro Grid franchise; World Champs play here next season”
<i>March 22, 1946</i>	“Kenny Washington signed by Los Angeles Rams”

<i>November 10, 1969</i>	“Gabriel cranks up the offense, 41-30; 93-yard bomb triggers Rams’ win over 49ers”
<i>December 1, 1969</i>	“Rams contain Sonny, clinch Coastal title, 24-13”
<i>December 28, 1969</i>	“Rams let the big one get away, lose 23-20 to Vikings”
<i>January 4, 1970</i>	“Revived Rams go out winner: 31-0 over Dallas in Playoff Bowl”
<i>December 6, 1971</i>	“Ellison’s day: 247 yards in 45-28 Ram win over Saints”
<i>December 3, 1973</i>	“Knox does it on first try; Rams win title, 26-0”

- December 27, 1983* “Rams give John Robinson a win that Jeane Dixon would be proud of, 24-17 over Dallas”
- December 10, 1984* “Eric the Great gains 2,007, eclipsing O.J; He breaks NFL rushing record”
- December 10, 1985* “Counted-out Rams demand recount, 27-20; L.A. clinches playoff spot”
- December 16, 1985* “Rams come through in a clinch; Brock’s four strikes shatter Cardinals, 46-14”
- January 5, 1986* “The Big D isn’t Dallas – it’s Dickerson, 20-0; Ram rushes for 248 yards”
- December 8, 1986* “Rams step on, over and around the Cowboys with 29-10 victory”
- September 26, 1988* “Everett’s 5 TD passes key Rams’ 45-31 win over Giants”
- December 19, 1988* “Rams zoom in, 38-16; Rout of 49ers makes difference because Jets win”
- December 25, 1989* “Rams escape, enter playoffs; They win 24-20 against Patriots”
- January 1, 1990* “Rams have the last word, 21-7 over Eagles”
